



## FACT SHEET

- Homes for the Holidays (HFTH), a program of the Warrick Dunn Family Foundation, was established in 1997 in Tampa, Fla.
- The Warrick Dunn Family Foundation's (WD-FF) mission is to provide opportunities for economically disadvantaged single-parents and children who have demonstrated a commitment to achieve financial independence and stability.
- Through HFTH, WD-FF provides \$5,000 in down payment assistance for single-parents who have qualified for a home through an approved housing program, such as Habitat for Humanity and other city-based down payment assistance programs.
- Single parents who are also first time homeowners are nominated by WD-FF official housing partners and must have completed required pre-qualification criteria, such as financial literacy and sweat equity hours, to be eligible for consideration.
- HFTH, through its presenting sponsor Aaron's, Inc. (NYSE: AAN) provides:

- To date, Dunn has rewarded 101 single parents and 270 children and dependents.
  - 39 mothers, one father, one grandmother and 110 children & dependents in Tampa, Fla.
  - 28 mothers and 81 children & dependents in Baton Rouge, La.
  - 29 mothers and 71 children & dependents in Atlanta, Ga.
  - One father, two mothers and 8 children in Tallahassee, Fla.
- The program was expanded in 1998 to include families in Dunn's hometown of Baton Rouge, La.
- When Warrick Dunn signed with the Atlanta Falcons in 2002, he brought HFTH with him thus expanding the program to the Greater Atlanta area.
- In 2007 HFTH began to include families in Tallahassee, Fla. where Dunn attended Florida State University.
